

 - domed/vaulted roof
 - Benches

MAYA MEDICINE - CONT'D


- Maize

RITUALS-BLOODLETTING






PURPOSE-

- this trance-like state and ability to communicate with their ancestors and the gods would demonstrate the great power of the ruler


- Magic Bone "Hueso"
